ART ON PAPER 1979 is the 15th Weatherspoon Annual Exhibition to be sponsored by the Weatherspoon Guild and underwritten by a grant from Dillard Paper Company, a major distributor of paper and packaging products in the Southeast which has its headquarters in Greensboro.

This year's exhibition is again entirely invitational, with most of the works coming from major city art dealers. It is limited to unique (i.e., one-of-a-kind) works made of or composed on paper by artists who have worked from the late 19th Century up to the present. Traditionally, the artists on the UNC-G Art Department faculty have been invited to place one work each in the exhibition, and this was the case again this year. A viewing of local artists' works, brought in by hand, yielded 22 works of interest and

quality. Certain other artists whose work attracted our attention during the year were invited on an individual basis.


In the first 14 years of ART ON PAPER, a total of 1867 works have been shown, most drawn from outside the immediate area. A collection resulting from this series, which we named "The Dillard Collection" in honor of Dillard Paper Company and the Dillard family, has grown to 328 works, 313 purchased from the exhibitions and 15 donated as gifts of artists or dealers.

It is our hope ART ON PAPER 1979 is a worthy successor to the previous exhibitions in the series.


